As We Gather

Holy Thursday, the night Jesus was betrayed, began with the disciples celebrating the Passover. Here, Jesus washed His disciples' feet, telling them to love one another, just as He loved them. He took a cup, gave it to His disciples to drink, and commanded them to remember Him by doing likewise. Then we go to the Garden of Gethsemane, where He was betrayed and arrested. On this day we remember the commands of Jesus and celebrate His coming to us in the bread and wine of Holy Communion.

P Jesus said, *"I did not come to invite virtuous people, but sinners."* Merciful God, we do not dare to this table trusting in our own goodness and virtue. We come because we are sinful people and need forgiveness. We come because we are hungry for life and need to be fed.

C **Father, forgive us and feed us.**

P We come because Christ has invited us sinners. We come in gratitude and wonder to offer our very selves to You in worship and adoration.

C **Father, accept our praise;**

A **Through Jesus Christ, our Lord.**

Old Testament Responsive Reading

Exodus 12:1-14

(Moses tells us how the first Passover meal was instituted.)

P The Lord spoke to Moses and Aaron in Egypt:

C "This month is to be the first month of the year for you.

P Give these instructions to the whole community of Israel: On the tenth day of this month each man must choose either a lamb or a young goat for his household.

C **If his family is too small to eat a whole animal, he and his next-door neighbor may share an animal, in proportion to the number of people and the amount that each person can eat.**

P You may choose either a sheep or a goat, but it must be a 1-year old male without any defects.

C **Then, on the evening of the fourteenth day of the month, the whole community of Israel will kill the animals.**

P The people are to take some of the blood and put it on the door posts and above the doors of the houses in which the animals are to be eaten.

C **That night the meat is to be roasted and eaten with bitter herbs with bread made without yeast.**

P Do not eat any of it raw or boiled, but eat it roasted while including the head, the legs, and the internal organs.

C **You must not leave any of it until morning; if any is left over, it must be burned.**

P You are to eat it quickly, for you are to be dressed for travel, with your sandals on your feet and your walking stick in your hand. It is the Passover Festival to honor Me, the Lord.

C **On that night I will go through the land of Egypt, killing every firstborn male, both human and animal, and punishing all the gods of Egypt. I am the Lord.**

P The blood on the doorposts will be a sign to mark the houses in which you live. When I see the blood, I will pass over you and will not harm you when I punish the Egyptians.

C **You must celebrate this day as a religious festival to remind you of what I, the Lord have done. Celebrate it for all time to come."**

P This is the word of the Lord.

C Thanks be to God.

Epistle

1 Corinthians 11:23-29

(Paul gives us the background of the institution of "The Last Supper")

For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "*This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me.*" For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

So then, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. Everyone ought to examine themselves before they eat of the bread and drink from the cup. For those who eat and drink without discerning the body of Christ eat and drink judgment on themselves

P This is the word of the Lord.

Holy Gospel

Luke 22, John 13 (selected verses)

(Jesus shares His last supper with His disciples.)

P Then came the day of Unleavened Bread on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, "*Go and make preparations for us to eat the Passover.*"

C "*Where do you want us to prepare for it?*" they asked.

P He replied, "*As you enter the city, a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him to the house that he enters, and say to the owner of the house, 'The Teacher asks: Where is the guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?'* He will show you a large room upstairs, all furnished. Make preparations there."

C **They left and found things just as Jesus had told them. So, they prepared the Passover.**

P The evening meal was in progress, and the devil had already prompted Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot, to betray Jesus. Jesus knew that the Father had put all things under his power, and that he had come from God and was returning to God; so he got up from the meal, took off his outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around his waist. After that, he poured water into a basin and began to wash his disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around him.

C **He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?"**

P Jesus replied, *“You do not realize now what I am doing, but later you will understand.”*

C *“No,” said Peter, “you shall never wash my feet.”*

P Jesus answered, *“Unless I wash you, you have no part with me.”*

C *“Then, Lord,” Simon Peter replied, “not just my feet but my hands and my head as well!”*

P Jesus answered, *“Those who have had a bath need only to wash their feet; their whole body is clean. And you are clean, though not every one of you.”* For he knew who was going to betray him, and that was why he said not everyone was clean.

When he had finished washing their feet, he put on his clothes and returned to his place and he said to them, *“I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. For I tell you, I will not eat it again until it finds fulfillment in the kingdom of God.”*

After taking the cup, he gave thanks and said, *“Take this and divide it among you. For I tell you I will not drink again from the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes.”*

And he took bread, gave thanks, and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, *“This is my body given for you; do this in remembrance of me.”*

In the same way, after the supper he took the cup, saying, *“This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you.”*

P This is the word of the Lord.

P He broke it and gave it ---

C *"God so love the world that He gave His only-begotten Son...."*

P He gave it to His disciples ---

C *"Truly I say to you, unless you turn and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven."*

P Saying, Take! Eat! ---

C **Take forgiveness, love and the very miracle of Christ Himself. Take it as a gift offered.**

P This is My body ---

C *"And Joseph took the body and wrapped it in a clean linen shroud and laid it in his own new tomb."*

P My body, which is given for you ---

C *"Whatever you ask in My name, I will do it..."*

P Do this to remember Me ---

C *"I will not leave you desolate; I will come to you. Yet a little while, and the world will see Me no more. But you will see Me; because I live, you will live also."*

P After the same manner also He took the cup ---

C *"The cup that I drink, you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized."*

P And when He had had His supper and had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying, *"Drink it, all of you! This is My blood ---*

C *"Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth ... and I saw the holy city, new Jerusalem... and I heard a loud voice from the throne, saying, "Behold, the dwelling of God is with men. He will dwell with them, and they shall be His people, and God Himself will be with them ... Behold, I made all things new!"*

P *Shed for you and for many ---*


C ***"Judge not, that you be not judged."* For God is love, and His love acts to set people free.**
